



## 15th ANNUAL LUIS HERNANDO DE LARRAMENDI INTERNATIONAL HISTORY OF CARLISM PRIZE

Following the decision of the jury for the 15th annual Prize, the first edition to award the prize to a research project instead of a finished work, this year's 15th annual prize is also meant for research projects.

1. This year's prize is divided into two separate stages:
  - In the first stage, a short four-month period in which to submit summaries of research project proposals to the jury is hereby opened.
  - The submission period for research project proposals therefore closes on 1 Septiembre 2016.
  - Proposals will be considered by the jury and a decision awarding the prize shall be issued within three months, that is, by no later than 1 December 2016. The prize winner shall have 15 months in which to complete the research project and submit the final work, which shall thus be submitted by 1 March 2018.
  - The prize shall comprise a monetary award of 6,000 euros, a portion of which shall be payable to finance research expenses. The prize also includes publication, provided that in the opinion of the jury the final work meets the requisite quality standards, and the jury's decision shall be final and unappealable.
  - Where it is decided to publish the final work, publication shall take place within six months of submission, and the prize amount shall be awarded at the formal presentation of the work to the public. If the work is not published, the prize amount shall be delivered with a letter announcing the decision.

3. The jury shall give preference to research projects focusing on relevant but as yet unpublished or to date underresearched aspects of the history of Carlism. As a result, special cases excepted, highly localized or highly specific projects will be at a disadvantage.

Project proposals should be typed, double spaced, on folio-size paper and signed by the applicant.

Two copies of the project should be submitted, and the text should also be submitted on a CD or other computer medium, preferably in the form of a Word or WordPerfect file.

Applicants should also submit an academic and personal history including their e-mail address, mailing address, and telephone number. Originals will not be returned nor will any correspondence be carried on with applicants.

5. Submission of a research project proposal to the jury signifies acceptance of all the terms and conditions of the prize, and in particular acceptance that the jury's decisions shall be final and unappealable.
