



## EIGHTEENTH EDITION OF THE “LUIS HERNANDO DE LARRAMENDI” INTERNATIONAL AWARD FOR THE HISTORY OF CARLISM

### BASIS

1.- Following the decision issued by the jury of the Seventeenth Edition, a new edition of the award, the Eighteenth Edition, is announced, coinciding with the centennial of the birth of our founder, *Don Ignacio Hernando de Larramendi*.

The aim of the award is the completion of a research project culminating in the publication of a historically accurate work of no less than 250 pages or 90,000 words.

2.- The instant announcement establishes two well-defined stages:

- The first stage opens a ten-month period as of the announcement and calls for the submittal to the jury a summary of the research project to be pursued, therein setting out the following information:
  1. Title.
  2. Key words defining the subject matter proposed.
  3. A summary.
  4. Approach and framework of the subject matter.
  5. Aims: Definition of the general, specific or special goals.
  6. Justification: Importance and relevance.
  7. Status of the subject matter: theoretical and conceptual context (technical interpretations used by authors who have already addressed the subject matter) and background on the research.
  8. Sources and methodology.
  9. Bibliography.
  10. Chronogram: Indication of terms and plan of work to follow over 24 months.
- The deadline for submitting projects will end on **1 June 2021**.
- Projects may be submitted in Spanish, French or English.
- At the second stage, following an assessment by the jury of the different projects submitted, a decision will be taken within a term of no longer than six months and tentatively by 28 September 2021, this date coinciding with the holding of a seminar entitled “Ignacio Larramendi and the revitalization of historical studies on Carlism” in principle to confer the award on one of the candidates, who will be given a 24-month term to submit the final work culminating the award-winning research project.

Thus, the work must be completed by 1 October 2023.

- The award includes a monetary award amounting to 10,000 euros, part of which may be advanced as a subsidy for research expenditure. The award also includes an electronic edition provided that the jury decisively considers the final work to meet the required standards. In the event of an electronic edition, 6 months after publication the content of the work will be freely accessible on the web for consultation by researchers throughout the world.
- The jury, or alternatively the Board of Trustees of the Foundation, may designate either one of the jury members or an expert to monitor the project as it develops.
- Once the final work has been submitted, the book will be published, if appropriate, during the following 6 months and the remaining amount of the award money not advanced to subsidize research will be paid out when the work is presented to the public. Any publication of the work will be electronic and in print upon demand, with 25 printed copies being given to the award-winner. Should the decision be taken not to publish the work, the amount of the pending award money will be paid out together with the announcement of said decision.

**3.-** The jury, operating under the chairmanship of the president of the Ignacio Larramendi Foundation, will consist of those members who have formed part of earlier juries as well as experts participating for the first time. The members of the jury for the Eighteenth Edition are as follow:

**Projects must be submitted in duplicate, typed on A4- or folio-sized sheets, double-spaced and signed by the candidate. They must likewise be submitted electronically, preferably as a Word or PDF document, sent in a USB flash drive or by email to the aforementioned address.**

**The candidate must also submit in electronic format his/her academic and personal background, including an email address, address and telephone number.**

An earlier-submitted non-awarded project may be submitted for a second time provided that said project has been modified to include new, relevant aspects that deserve consideration.

Original projects will not be returned. Nor will correspondence be exchanged with their authors.

**6.-** The submittal of a project for this award constitutes the acceptance of the pertinent conditions and recognition that the decisions of the jury are final.
